


The following two graphs provided the consolidated quantitative survey results of this multisection offering. These consolidated results focus on student rating's on teaching and course design.



This is just a personal opinion but I don't like how learning C should be required for those taking 1st year engineering, I compared classes with CompSci students and they start off with easier classes such as learning to code in java. As someone with no previous coding experience I struggle a lot with coding and due to how heavy my other classes are I'm not left with much time to work on the assignments so i often have to do it with only a few days left which burns me out and I begin to lose interest in actually handing in the work.

From what lve learned, coding is bound to get errors, and problem solving is 80% of the process, penalizing student for not writing perfect code heavily is discouraging.
